Needed items include personal hygiene items (body wash, shampoo, conditioner, and deodorant), toilet paper, paper towels, can openers, and plastic cups. Several of these items are continuing needs from last month, but remain in short supply right now.

Harmony House very much appreciates our donations for rehousing and the clothing and shoes for the day shelter. Other items donated this past month include a small television, two toilet seats, small rugs, plastic hangers, a trash can and kitchen supplies. New underwear and socks are always needed by their clients. They also very much appreciate donations of water during the hot spells of weather.

Items for donation may be brought to the church and placed in the "wagon display" in the Narthex or taken to the Blessings Room, and placed on the Harmony House table. If anyone is downsizing or replacing pieces of furniture or has other large items to donate, Harmony House is able to pick up from your home. Harmony House August has a been a busy month! We made additional donations to the Family of 7 we adopted in July. There were crib, high chair, toy box, collapsible storage boxes, books, toys, new and used clothing, diapers, wipes, baby shampoo and ointment. Also all kinds of cleaning products, hand soap, dishes, glasses and steak knives, cutting board and knife, sheets, baby blanket, hammer, duct tape were donated.

When 2 additional Harmony House **rehoused families** with children turned into 8 families with 18 school age children and several toddlers, we switched into high gear to have children supplied with school needs before the first day of school. We donated 18 book bags stuffed with school supplies according to age level, water bottles, tooth brush and stuffed animals. A variety of hygiene and cleaning items, baby blanket, diapers, baby needs and nice toddler toys were added for families as needed. Each family also received blankets and pillows with our signature handmade pillow cases.

We sent the **Harmony House Day Shelter** shoes and socks, shorts, T shirts, sun hats and a small water cooler jug.

As always generous donations were sent to **Children's Home Society of WV** this month. We sent 4 boxes of men's dress clothing, 3 large bags of bedding for kids, a bag of beautiful gently used stuffed animals, lunch boxes and a duffle bag. Also donated were lots of books and a great collection of National Geographics, toddler toys with fresh batteries and lots of clothing for kids and toddlers, some with tags still on them.



A shopping bag and 2 dress bags full of nice clothing were sent to **Dress for Success**. As you clean your closets remember, they need clothing for working women in all kinds of jobs, including scrubs in a variety of sizes

Blessings Room After donating to all those families this month we are in need of more pillow cases if anyone is willing to do some sewing. There may be a few kits left, but many of those prepared have already been assembled and given away. We were gifted more fabric. See Nancy or Linda H if you would like to get some fabric to work on. We need to switch our attention to shoeboxes and stockings. Small toys for these are always appreciated. Please don't get burned out on making donations. Respond only to those projects that speak to you and fit your budget.

We donated 2 book bags and a substantial supply of school items to both the **City Mission** and **Children's Home Society** for children in our community. Generous donations have allowed us to make all these donations and restock the Blessings Room with school supplies for future needs. 


